2 pts	Provides accurate explanation of how Brumidi was a fixture at the Capitol AND uses relevant supporting details to support the explanation. Brumidi was a fixture of the Capitol because he was always working. He worked at the Capitol for two and a half decades.
	Provides explanation of how Brumidi was a fixture at the Capitol without using relevant supporting details. Brumidi was a fixture because he spent most of his career at the Capitol. He was important to the Capitol and American history.
1 pt	Provides details of Brumidi's time at the Capitol without an explicit explanation of how he was a fixture. Brumidi worked through six presidents' terms and thirteen Congresses.
0 pts	No explanation/inaccurate explanation of how Brumidi was a fixture at the Capitol is given; no support/irrelevant support provided. Brumidi helped design the capitol. A cast iron dome was built in March of 1855. No explanation/inaccurate explanation of how Brumidi was a fixture at the Capitol is given; no support/irrelevant support provided. Brumidi was the subject of a book printed in 1998. It explains his painting techniques and the political context of his work.

General Constructed Response Scoring Guidelines:

- Three to five sentences is considered an appropriate response length to adequately answer a constructed response. However, length does not count toward score. A response that satisfies the criteria for one or two points will earn that score, regardless of length.
- Spelling and grammar (including using complete sentences) do not count toward score. Responses, however, must be clear and understandable.
- Unless it contradicts the rest of the response, extraneous information will not reduce points earned.
